

MINUTES.

Mountain Park Commission. Jan. 27th, 1925.

A regular meeting of the Mountain Park Commission was held on the fourteenth floor of the Daniels & Fisher Stores Building at 12:15 P.M.

Those present were: Chairman Willcox and Messrs. Harvey, MacFarland, Sommers, Vail and Steinhauer.

Mr. Sommers agreed to see Mr. Seerie and they to take up with the State Highway Commission the question of road from Echo Lake to Idaho Springs, and ascertain if some additional funds could be appropriated to this project by the State in order to secure sufficient federal aid money to insure its completion during this year.

Mr. Vail moved that the city appropriate \$5,000. to this joint project of connecting Mr. Evans Highway at Echo Lake to Idaho Springs. Motion carried.

The question of the addition to Overland Park by purchase of acreage to the west of Overland Park, a portion of which land lies outside the city limits of Denver and hence comes under the Mountain Parks, was discussed, however, a bill being now before the State Legislators to annex this ground to Denver, no action by this Board was deemed necessary.

It was moved the Hosa Lodge be turned over to the 40 & 8 Boys for a museum for the war relics belonging to this organization, and that \$4000. be set aside to build an additional room and for alterations. Motion carried.

The County Commissioners of Jefferson County made a request that the City of Denver take over the maintenance of the road from Denver to Golden or Morrison. The Commission refused to do this.

It was the opinion of the Commission that arrangements be made thru Mr. Vail to have soundings taken or drillings made to ascertain the exact location of the Bed Rock for the proposed dam at Evergreen and that plans and specifications be made for construction of the dam.

A resolution on the death of John A. Burnett was ordered spread on the minutes, and a copy sent to the family.
